## CAPTIVE CONSTRICTOR SNAKES: PYTHONS AND BOAS IN THE USA

**Separating Facts from Fiction** 



In the last two decades, boas and pythons have become an increasingly popular exotic pet snakes across the USA. With the increased knowledge in their captive husbandry, there is now a bigger and better selection of captive bred snakes than ever before. By supplying the pet market with high quality healthy reptiles, the private breeders are greatly reducing the demand on the wild populations.

Unfortunately, special interest animal rights, AR, lobby groups are trying to increase their income by creating a public hysteria that the constrictors will invade the USA, and wipe out the human and native wildlife populations. This is simply not true, as the table below proves. The constrictor issue is limited to the southern tip of Florida, and should be dealt with on the local, not federal level.

CONCLUSION: There is no public safety issue due to the captive or at large constrictor snakes.
